



RESIDENTS AND FELLOWS NOT YET CERTIFIED IN GENERAL PEDIATRICS

While you are not yet certified in General Pediatrics, it is never too early to start working ahead. As part of the MOC for Residents program, physicians have full access to all ABP-developed activities, including quality improvement and self-assessment activities. Prior to becoming certified in General Pediatrics, you can “bank” Part 4 points towards your first MOC cycle by participating in approved quality improvement activities.

Your first official MOC cycle will start after you pass the Initial Certifying Exam. Please make sure your contact information is updated within your ABP Portfolio, so you don't miss the 'Welcome to MOC' communication we will send in your first year. Which Activities Are Bankable?

- ✓ Your own QI project (1-10 pediatricians) that you have submitted to the ABP
- ✓ ABP-approved institutional QI projects (more than 10 pediatricians)
- ✓ ABP-developed Performance Improvement Modules (PIMs)
- ✓ ABP-approved QI online modules such as EQIPP with the AAP

What About Self-Assessment Activities?

ABP-developed self-assessment activities are free and may be of interest to you; however, Part 2 points will not count towards your first MOC cycle.

- ✓ ABP-developed activities such as Question of the Week, Decision Skills, and other topic specific self-assessments
- ✓ Your attestation of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) education
- ✓ Internet Search and Learn, such as UpToDate
- ✓ Credit for resuscitation certifications (ACLS, ATLS, BLS, NRP, and PALS)
- ✓ ABP-approved self-assessment activities through organizations such as the AAP
- ✓ Many other CME activities that also meet ABP requirements (<https://www.cmepassport.org/>)

How Do You Access Activities?

- ✓ By November of your first year of residency, you can register on the ABP website to create your ABP Portfolio.
- ✓ You can search for activities of interest through your ABP Portfolio.
- ✓ After you become initially certified, all banked Part 4 points are automatically added to your ABP Portfolio, and those points count towards your first set of requirements.
