Confidentiality Agreement for ABP Appointees

I agree, at all times, to abide by the ABP's Privacy Policy.

I agree to abide by the above statement.

No individual appointed to ABP committees, subboards, and the Board of Directors shall, unless (i) legitimately authorized in their role as an appointee; (ii) authorized by the ABP's Privacy Policy; (iii) or otherwise required by law, ever use or disclose:

- any non-public information about any Diplomate of the ABP or applicant for an ABP examination without the written consent of the individual to whom such information pertains,
- 2. any non-public information about an ABP examination without the consent of the ABP,
- 3. any non-public financial information regarding the ABP without the consent of the ABP,
- 4. any information used or disclosed to an appointee or consultant to the ABP that is protected pursuant to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA"), or any ABP copyrighted, trade secret, proprietary, or confidential material. Generally speaking, materials you obtain from portions of Self-Assessment Modules, Decision Skills Module, Question of the Week Module, and Performance Improvement Modules shall be considered the confidential and proprietary information of the ABP, however, there are materials made available via the module that are specifically intended to be downloaded and displayed, and those materials will not be considered confidential information. The material developed by the ABP for its intraining, certification, and maintenance of certification examinations and MOCA-Peds assessments are copyrighted as the sole property of the ABP and may not be reproduced in any way. Reproduction of copyrighted material, in whole or in part, is a federal offense. Irrespective of copyright, any attempt to distribute ABP in-training, certification, or maintenance of certification examinations or MOCA-Peds assessments. in whole or part, undermines the fairness of the certification process and will be considered unethical, unprofessional, and dishonorable conduct and will constitute grounds for the ABP to take any action deemed appropriate by the ABP and its legal counsel.
